February is recognized as Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month. Not only does Safe Passage offer services for adults, we also offer services to children and teens who have experienced and/or witnessed abuse.

Children's counselor, Chaniqua, describes a teen counseling session: "Our sessions consist of providing adolescents a safe place to discuss personal experiences of teen dating violence. While most teens are told what to do by authority figures, the role of the counselor is to empower teens to make the best decisions for themselves. Counselors support teens through experiences of teen dating violence by providing education to adolescents about domestic abuse and its effects. Encouraging clients to recognize healthy and unhealthy characteristics in relationships is significant for teens to break the cycle of abuse."

Swept Under the Rug

Safe Passage staff are excited to announce a collaboration with Northern Illinois University's Pick Museum of Anthropology!

In order to raise awareness to sexual violence, sexual assault counselors have worked alongside their clients to tell their stories of abuse through 3 main art exhibits in an project titled "Swept Under the Rug."

The purpose of the exhibit is to shed light on the widespread impact of sexual violence on survivors in our community and our culture. The exhibit will address issues that are

often seen as taboo and "inappropriate" for open discussion. Sexual violence will no longer be swept under the rug! The show will provide space for learning about these issues as well as space for community members and survivors to respond.
